

New Plants for 2010



Agave americana var. protoamericana

(Code: 7429)

The ghostly blue-gray evergreen foliage has pronounced bud imprints on the leaf surface. This exotic architectural plant can be used as a focal point. (3'-4' x 3'-4') Zn7.



Agave harvardiana

(Code: 7428)

The stout gray evergreen leaves are armed with marginal teeth and a sharp terminal spine. Over time, it will form a large rosette of foliage 3' tall and wide. (3' x 3') Zn6.



Agave parryi

Parry's Agave (Code: 6301)

Striking blue-green, sword-like succulent evergreen leaves have long spines. This classic desert garden plant is perfect as a dramatic focal point in the garden or as a container plant. (30"-36" x 36"-40") Zn7.



Agave schidigera 'Black Widow'

Agave (Code: 7288)

Rigid, dark green succulent leaves have silver marking and edges with curly fibers. The compact symmetrical growth habit makes it useful in the rock garden or in containers. (12" x 18") Zn8.



Agave schidigera 'Shira ito no Ohi'

Agave (Code: 7289)

Each thick dark green leaf has a crisp white margin, highlighted by silver interior markings and edged with white curly fibers. The dramatic, symmetrical, compact growth habit makes this succulent perfect for the rock garden or for use in containers. (12" x 12"-16") Zn8.



Agave striata

Hedgehog Agave (Code: 6305)

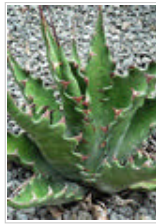
Symmetrical, spherical rosettes consist of hard curved, narrow leaves with a pronounced terminal spike. Makes an excellent container plant. (24"-36" x 36"-40") Zn10.



Antennaria dioica 'Rubra'

Pussy Toes (Code: 6663)

Deep red flowerheads appear on 4-8" stems above tufts of tiny, tight gray leaves. Forms a low, creeping mat that is perfect between paving stones or for the sunny rock garden. This is a tough plant that will take hot spots and poor, dry soil. (4"-6" x 12") Zn4.



Agave gentryi 'Jaws'

Hardy Century Plant (Code: 7279)

The name reflects the fantastic shape of the glossy evergreen leaves which are concave and heavily toothed. It forms a large clump that commands attention. (24" x 36"-48") Zn7.



Agave montana 'Baccarat'

Mountain Agave (Code: 7282)

NEW! This Agave features broad, blue-green evergreen leaves with beautiful silver markings on the back of the leaf, reminiscent of crystal etching. Perfect for desert rock gardens. (24"-36" x 24"-36") Zn7.



Agave parryi 'J.C. Raulston'

Parry's Agave (Code: 7285)

This Agave forms symmetrical rosettes of blue-gray wedge-shaped evergreen leaves. Slow to form offsets, it is a good choice where space is small, or for use in containers. (24" x 24"-36") Zn7.



Agave schidigera 'Mr. Ripples'

Agave (Code: 7287)

Wide blue-green undulating evergreen leaves form a large upright clump. It makes a spectacular focal point. (4'-5' x 4'-5') Zn8.



Agave 'Silver Surfer'

Century Plant (Code: 7277)

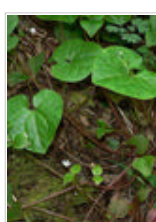
Dramatic, rigid, silvery-blue succulent leaves grow into a 5' tall specimen plant! This architectural plant makes an exotic focal point in the garden or use in containers. (5' x 6'-9") Zn8.



Amsonia 'Blue Ice'

Blue Star Flower (Code: 6680)

Blue star-like flowers appear in spring for a longer period than the species. This compact form is very vigorous and turns brilliant yellow in fall. (12"-15" x 24") Zn5.



Asarum caudatum

Wild Ginger (Code: 5167)

Northwest native perennial with evergreen heart-shaped leaves that slowly grow to form a groundcover. It grows best in moist, but well drained soils in open woodlands. (4-5" x 18"-24") Zn4.





Asclepias tuberosa 'Gay Butterflies'
Butterfly Weed (Code: 2176)

NEW! The bright yellow, orange and red flowers are a magnet for butterflies. This meadow wildflower requires somewhat dry, well-drained soil and a sunny location. (24" x 18"-24") Zn4.



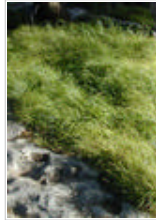
Camassia quamash
Camas (Code: 6352)

Loose clusters of star-like, deep blue blossoms are carried on 1-2 ft. spikes from late spring through early summer. Grass-like basal leaves go dormant in summer after flowering. Native to NW marshes and moist meadows. (20"-24" x 12"-16") Zn4.



Campanula x pulloides 'Jelly Bells'
Bellflower (Code: 4587)

Large, deep violet-blue nodding bells bloom over a bright green mat of foliage in spring. A vigorous and attractive low growing perennial, it often reblooms. (8"-12" x 12"-15") Zn5. PPAF Propagation Prohibited.



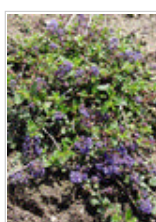
Carex retroflexa var. texensis
Sedge (Code: 7276)

Native sedge from south central US, with fine, evergreen grassy blades and grows best in partial shade to bright light. Useful planted between stepping stones or to create a grassy groundcover. (6"-12" x 18"-24") Zn7.



Carex subfusca
Rusty Sedge (Code: 7419)

This native western US sedge is found everywhere from the sea to the desert. It is low growing with narrow, upright, dark green leaves that spread to form a low maintenance lawn or groundcover. Easy to grow in almost any situation. (4"-10" x 18"-36") Zn5.



Ceanothus 'Centennial'
California Lilac (Code: 6670)

This low-growing, spreading, evergreen shrub has dark blue flowers in spring. A native cultivar of the Pacific coast, it is tolerant of summer heat and drought. (8"-12" x 6') Zn8.



Ceanothus Tuxedo
California Lilac (Code: 7043)

The dark bronze-purple foliage is a real breakthrough in breeding! This distinctive evergreen shrub has an open, upright habit that responds well to pruning. Lavender blue flowers appear in abundance in late summer and fall. (6'-8' x 6'-8') Zn8. PPAF



Chasmanthium latifolium 'River Mist'
Woodland Sea Oats (Code: 6648)

NEW! The striking green and white variegated foliage makes this a great specimen plant. Late summer and early fall brings dangling oat-like spikelets that provide interest well into the winter as they dry out. (30"-36" x 24"-30") Zn5. PPAF Propagation Prohibited



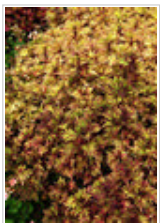
Coleus (Solenostemon) 'Dappled Apple'TM
Coleus (Code: 7460)

Wide apple-green leaves are laced with yellow veins and splashed with yellow flecks. For best color, plant in bright shade. (18"-24" x 18"-24") Zn10.



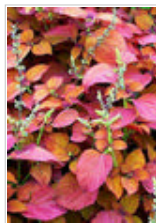
Coleus (Solenostemon) 'Henna'
Coleus (Code: 7583)

The leaves have saw-like edges, are chartreuse to copper colored and have dark burgundy undersides. It needs little pinching and stays dense and uniform. (18"-24" x 18"-24") Zn10. PP19149



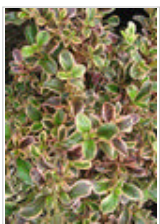
Coleus (Solenostemon) 'Mocha Mint'
Coleus (Code: 7582)

Multi-colored duckfoot-type leaves are mottled with green, yellow and red flecks. For best color, plant in bright shade. (12"-18" x 12"-18") Zn10. PP20387



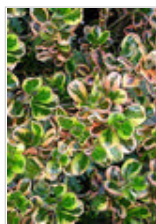
Coleus (Solenostemon) 'Sedona'
Coleus (Code: 7461)

Named after the reddish rocks of Sedona, Arizona, the leaves of this Coleus are a rich coppery-orange with dark red spots later in the season. The richest colors occur when grown in sun. (18"-24" x 18"-24") Zn10.



Coprosma repens 'Evening Glow'
Mirror Plant (Code: 6643)

This very colorful upright-growing shrub has striking variegated foliage with irregular yellow patches. The glossy evergreen foliage turns bright orange-red in late summer-to-fall and remains so until new growth in spring. The flowers are inconspicuous. (4'-5' x 3'-4') Zn9.

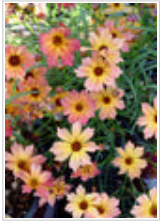


Coprosma repens 'Pink Splendor'
Mirror Plant (Code: 6644)

This beautiful dense, mounding shrub has variegated leaves with green centers, surrounded by creamy peach-pink-to-yellow margins. The glossy evergreen leaves develop a rosy-pink glow in cooler temperatures. The flowers are inconspicuous. (6'-8' x 4'-5') Zn9.

Coreopsis 'Mango Punch'

Tickseed (Code: 7435)

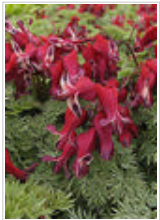
Mango-orange flowers have a red overlay. The unique color and free flowering habit add sunshine to the garden all season! (12" x 18") Zn9. PP18475 EU25414



Cornus nuttallii

Pacific Dogwood (Code: 7271)

Native deciduous understory tree with white flower bracts in spring and often again in fall. The bright red fruits are a favorite of many birds. It prefers to grow at the edge of open woodlands. (25' plus x 20') Zn6.



Dicentra 'Burning Hearts'

Fringed Bleeding Heart (Code: 4585)

Striking red bleeding hearts with white fringed tips bloom most of the season above blue-green, feathery foliage. (10"-12" x 12") Zn4. PPAF Propagation prohibited.



Echinacea 'Hot Papaya'

Coneflower (Code: 7294)

The blooms emerge with florescent, papaya-orange colored ray petals with a deep red-orange pompom. Each pompom has a remarkable papaya colored halo in the center that grows as it ages. (30"-36" x 24"-30") Zn4. PPAF



Echinacea purpurea 'Flame Thrower'

Coneflower (Code: 7430)

Flaming hot two-toned blooms of orange and yellow with a dark central cone light up the middle of the border! This Echinacea has a well-branched habit, is easy to grow, and will bloom all summer! (34"-36" x 36"-40") Zn4.

Felicia fruticosa

Shrub Aster (Code: 4962)

Violet-purple daisies make an impressive show in the spring. The blooms stand nicely above the foliage, forming a shrubby plant. (24"-30" x 24"-30") Zn9.



Fragaria vesca

Woodland Strawberry (Code: 7270)

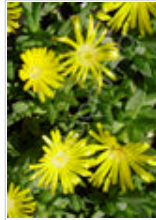
NEW! North American native deciduous woodland groundcover with 3 leaflets and white flowers in spring followed by small, sweet strawberries in summer. (2"-4" x 18"-24") Zn3.



Cornus canadensis

Bunchberry (Code: 2440)

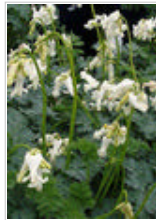
NEW! Refined and beautiful native North American groundcover with white dogwood flowers that appear in summer. Red berries appear in fall on foliage that is evergreen to semi-evergreen. It grows best where summers are cool to moderate in temperature. (4"-6" x 12"-18") Zn3.



Delosperma congestum 'Gold Nugget'

Ice Plant (Code: 3903)

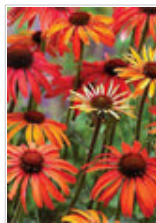
NEW! Low-growing succulent leaves with bright gold, daisy-like flowers bloom in summer. This is a great plant for dry soils and rock gardens. (1-2" x 12") Zn5.



Dicentra 'Ivory Hearts'

Fringed Bleeding Heart (Code: 4583)

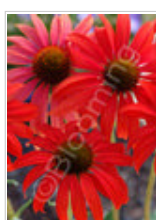
Creamy-white bleeding hearts bloom May to September above gray-green, fern-like foliage. (10"-12" x 12"-15") Zn4. PP15599 Propagation prohibited.



Echinacea 'Hot Summer'

Coneflower (Code: 7302)

Flowers open yellow and steadily turn to scarlet as they mature. The result is a harmony of fiery shades all on one plant, all at the same time! (30"-36" x 24"-30") Zn4. PPAF



Echinacea 'Tomato Soup'

Coneflower (Code: 6596)

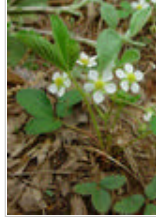
Stunning warm tomato-red coneflowers up to 5" across! Plants are well branched, vigorous and bloom mid-summer until frost. (36" x 24"-36") Zn4. PP19427 Propagation Prohibited.



Festuca californica

California Fescue (Code: 7420)

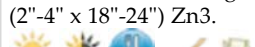
Finely-textured grayish blue-green blades form a soft evergreen mound. Drooping, violet-tinged flower stems are held above the foliage from late spring to early summer. It's wonderful as a groundcover or edging plant. (12"-18" x 12"-16") Zn7.



Fragaria virginiana

Wild Strawberry (Code: 7269)

NEW! North American native strawberry with white flowers in late spring and summer. Sweet red berries are about 1.2" across in summer. Often seen in open woods or moist meadows throughout North America. (2"-4" x 18"-24") Zn3.



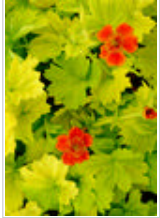

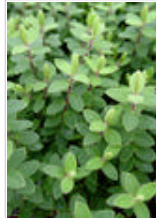
Gaultheria shallon
Salal (Code: 6347)
 Pacific Northwest evergreen groundcover or low spreading shrub that tolerates dry shade to full sun. Urn-shaped white flowers appear in spring and produce dark purple edible berries. Salal leaves are often used by florists. (18"-30" x 24"-36") Zn6.



Gentiana 'True Blue'
Gentian (Code: 7303)
 Large 2" tubular blue flowers open at the nodes all up and down the stems, midsummer to early fall. The plant has smooth, green, lance-shaped leaves. Hummingbirds and butterflies love the flowers! (24"-30" x 12"-18") Zn4. PP20433 Propagation prohibited.



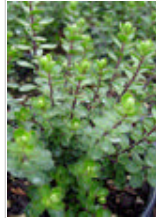
Geum coccineum 'Eos'
Avens (Code: 4977)
 Fiery orange-red flowers bloom above unique, large golden foliage. It has a spreading habit and commands attention even when not in bloom. (14" x 12"-18") Zn5.



Hebe 'Inverey'
Hebe (Code: 6665)
 This small, low-growing shrub, has charming, sage-colored leaves that are beautifully offset by dark purple leaf bases and stems. Lavender-purple flowers appear from late spring into summer and sometimes again in fall. (6"-8" x 18"-24") Zn7.



Hebe 'Walter Buccleugh'
Hebe (Code: 4515)
 This low-growing evergreen shrublet is perfect for rock gardens. The spear-shaped leaves are gray-green with red edges and flower spikes of red-purple appear in early summer. (12"-18" x 18") Zn7.



Hebe x 'Champion'
Hebe (Code: 7042)
 NEW! Bred from H. 'Autumn Glory', this cultivar features improved hardiness and disease resistance! Violet-blue flowers bloom in summer and in fall. Small, glossy dark evergreen foliage appears on purple stems. (15"-20" x 16"-24") Zn7. PP14866 Propagation Prohibited.



Helianthemum 'Fire Dragon'
Sun Rose (Code: 5679)
 Warm translucent orange blooms cover the plant in late spring. Low growing, evergreen foliage is perfect for the rock garden or front of the perennial border. (10" x 18") Zn4.



Heliopsis 'Tuscan Sun'
 (Code: 7575)
 NEW! The large single golden yellow daisies appear in mid-summer and are invaluable for brightening the summer garden. A rugged and exceedingly cold hardy plant, 'Tuscan Sun' is the most compact Heliopsis available. (12"-18" x 18"-24") Zn3.



Helleborus x hybridus 'Carousel'
Hellebore, Lenten Rose (Code: 7243)
 The flowers have an anemone form with picoteed edges and contrasting center "bosses". It blooms from late winter through early spring on evergreen foliage. This rare seed strain was developed by Ernie & Marietta O'Byrne. (18"-24" x 24"-30") Zn4.



Helleborus x hybridus 'Mellow Yellow'
Hellebore, Lenten Rose (Code: 7244)
 The single flowers are bright yellow to apricot, some with purple splashes and picotee edges. It blooms from late winter to early spring on evergreen foliage. This seed strain was developed by Ernie and Marietta O'Byrne. (18"-24" x 24"-30") Zn4.



Helleborus x hybridus 'Regal Ruffles'
Hellebore, Lenten Rose (Code: 7245)
 The large, ruffled, double flowers are up to 3" across and have triple the usual number of petals! Flower colors include red, green, pink, yellow and picotees, and bloom on evergreen foliage. From Ernie & Marietta O'Byrne. (18"-24" x 24"-30") Zn4.



Helleborus x hybridus 'Splashdown'
Hellebore, Lenten Rose (Code: 7246)
 The single flowers have bold splashes of burgundy to purple painted on an ivory white background. It blooms late winter to early spring on evergreen foliage. From Ernie & Marietta O'Byrne. (18"-24" x 24"-30") Zn4.



Hemerocallis 'Mary Reed'
Daylily (Code: 4200)
 Raspberry-purple flowers have a white midrib and green throat. The flowers rebloom in warmer climates and stay open into the night rather than closing at sunset like most daylilies. It has a dwarf habit. (12"-15" x 18"-24") Zn3.



Hemerocallis 'Purple d'Oro'
Daylily (Code: 4458)
 NEW! Clusters of 3" soft purple flowers bloom repeatedly almost all season long. Similar to H. 'Stella d'Oro' in all aspects but flower color. The moderate height is perfect for beds, borders or containers. Unbeatable! (18" x 18"-24") Zn3.





Heuchera 'Lime Marmalade'

Coral Bells (Code: 7418)

NEW! This vigorous lime-green sport of H. 'Marmalade' boasts frilly foliage on a large mounding form. Larger growing than H. 'Lime Rickey' it is also tough and heat tolerant. (10" x 18") Zn4. PPAF,PVR Propagation Prohibited



Heucherella 'Sweet Tea'

Foamy Bells (Code: 7415)

The orange tea colored leaves have cinnamon star markings that simply glow in the shade! The big maple-like leaves darken in summer, then lighten again in fall. Large growing, it is also tolerant of heat and humidity. (18"-24" x 18"-24") Zn4. PPAF,PVR Propagation Prohibited



Ipomoea batatas 'Sweet Georgia Deep Purple'

Sweet Potato (Code: 7576)

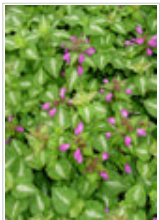
Deep purple lobed leaves spread vigorously along the ground. A great plant to use as a temporary groundcover or trailing from baskets and containers. (5"-6" x 24"-36") Zn10.



Iris tenax

Oregon Iris (Code: 2980)

This Pacific Northwest native features large violet flowers with lavender-blue to purple (occasionally yellow) falls. Stunning and different! (12"-15" x 9") Zn7.



Lamium maculatum 'Elizabeth de Haas'

Deadnettle (Code: 5582)

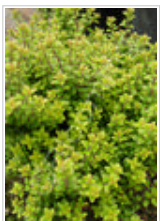
The green leaves have silvery markings in the midrib. Dark lavender-pink flowers appear in summer. It's beautiful when trailing from pots or as a groundcover for shade. (6" x 24") Zn4.



Leucanthemum x superbum 'Highland White Dream'

Shasta Daisy (Code: 3993)

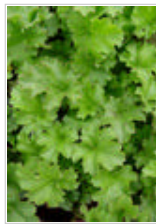
Semi-double daisies are 4-5" across and bloom from July through September when spent flowers are removed. It makes an excellent cut flower. (3' x 2'-3') Zn3. PPAF Propagation Prohibited.



Lonicera nitida 'Twiggy'

Box Honeysuckle (Code: 4663)

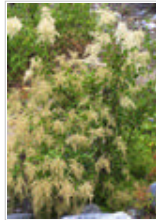
This dwarf shrub has twiggy growth, and is lined with tiny yellow, evergreen leaves that hold their bright color most of the season. Fragrant creamy-white flowers bloom in spring. (24"-36" x 24"-36") Zn7.



Heuchera 'Malachite'

Coral Bells (Code: 4981)

Ruffled and curled, soft green foliage is topped by hundreds of dainty white flowers in spring. The evergreen foliage is durable and easy to grow. (12"-18" x 12"-18") Zn4.



Holodiscus discolor

Oceanspray (Code: 4433)

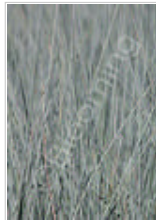
This Northwest native deciduous shrub has slender arching branches and fuzzy green leaves. Creamy flowers bloom in drooping panicles 8" long from early to mid-summer. (8'-10' x 4'-8') Zn5.



Ipomoea batatas 'Sweet Georgia Red Heart'

Sweet Potato (Code: 7577)

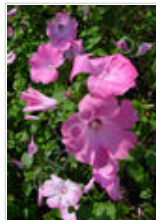
Red-purple heart-shaped leaves spread vigorously on the ground to create a temporary groundcover. It also is commonly used to trail out of containers and baskets. (4"-6" x 24"-36") Zn10.



Juncus inflexus 'Blue Arrows'

Common Rush (Code: 4984)

NEW! Gray-blue foliage grows in stiff, upright clumps on this moisture loving rush. Heat and drought tolerant, it's perfect for containers or as accent in the garden. (24"-36" x 18"-24") Zn5.



Lavatera x clementii 'Chamallow'

Tree Mallow (Code: 4484)

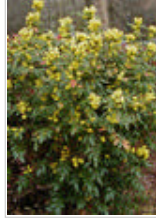
Single, non-fading, bright pink saucer-shaped flowers bloom over a long period in summer. This bushy, upright form has velvety, gray-green leaves. (36"-48" x 30"-36") Zn6. PP15478 Propagation Prohibited.



Ligularia 'Last Dance'

Golden Ray (Code: 7299)

This compact Ligularia has very large dark green leaves that create a bold contrast in the shade garden. Bright yellow, daisy-like flowers appear in late summer. The foliage makes a bold contrast with ferns. (18" x 24") Zn5.

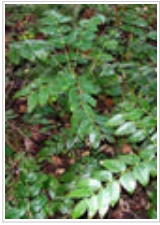


Mahonia aquifolium

Oregon Grape (Code: 6965)

This Pacific Northwest shrub is known for its bold-textured, evergreen, holly-like leaves that turn deep burgundy in winter. New leaves emerge reddish in spring when the yellow flowers appear. Blue berries appear in late summer and fall. (3'-5' x 3'-5') Zn5.





Mahonia nervosa

Cascade Oregon Grape Holly (Code: 7266)

This low-growing NW native evergreen shrub spreads by rhizomes to form thickets. The evergreen leaflets have toothed edges and resemble holly foliage. Fragrant pale yellow flowers bloom in spring followed by blue berries in summer and fall. (18"-24" x 2'-4") Zn5.



Malus fusca

Pacific Crabapple (Code: 7265)

This NW native small tree has white to blush pink flowers in spring followed by yellow to red berries in fall. It prefers moist soil by streams and is also salt tolerant. Good for wildlife. (20' plus x 20' or more) Zn6.



Manfreda 'Macho Mocha'

(Code: 7293)

Thick succulent green leaves are washed with lavender and splashed with mocha colored spots when grown in full sun. Exotic 8' tall flower spikes appear in late spring. (3' x 3') Zn8.



Pennisetum alopecuroides 'Piglet'

Fountain Grass (Code: 4857)

NEW! Dwarf fountain grass taller than P. 'Little Bunny', but shorter than P. 'Hameln'. Foxtail-like plumes are showy and contrast nicely with other summer blooming perennials. (15"-18" x 18"-24") Zn6. PP19074 Propagation Prohibited.



Pennisetum alopecuroides 'Redhead'

Fountain Grass (Code: 4241)

Bronze-red, feather-like plumes are produced in late August to early September, a month earlier than others of this genus. A perfect companion plant for Echinacea. (4' x 3') Zn5.



Pennisetum 'Princess Molly'

Fountain Grass (Code: 7579)

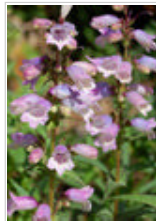
Thin, beautiful, deep burgundy leaves form a very compact grass. Plants have excellent disease resistance and weather tolerance. It will not flower except in total frost-free areas. (14"-20" x 18"-24") Zn8. PPAF



Pennisetum purpureum 'Princess Caroline'

Fountain Grass (Code: 7578)

'Princess Caroline' provides brilliant purple foliage on plants that stay compact. It has better disease resistance, excellent weather tolerance and sturdier growth. Plants will not flower except in total frost-free areas. (36" x 30"-36") Zn8. PPAF



Penstemon 'Stapleford Gem'

Beard Tongue (Code: 3774)

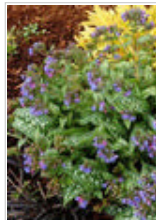
Light, lilac-blue, bell-shaped flowers have creamy-white throats and are streaked with lilac. The blooms of this vigorous grower appear in summer. (36" x 12"-16") Zn7.



Phlox paniculata 'Blushing Shortwood'

Phlox (Code: 6604)

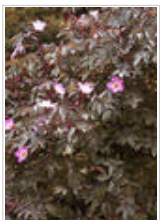
This compact form displays clusters of bi-colored blooms of soft lavender-pink and white in midsummer. Nice upright habit makes it a great addition to the perennial garden. Disease resistant. (20" x 12"-16") Zn4. PPAF Propagation Prohibited.



Pulmonaria 'Trevi Fountain'

Lungwort (Code: 7458)

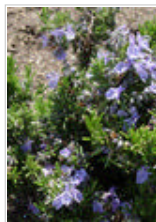
The narrow green leaves are spotted with silver. Clusters of deep cobalt-blue flowers appear in early spring. The foliage is heat tolerant and mildew resistant. (18"-24" x 18"-24") Zn4.



Rosa glauca

Rose (Code: 3998)

This rose is grown more for its dusty mauve foliage than flowers. It contrasts well with tall blue foliage plants like Panicum 'Dallas Blue'. Single pink flowers appear in June. Very hardy and carefree, it grows up to 7' tall. (7' x 5'-7") Zn3.



Rosmarinus 'Bonnie Jean'

Rosemary (Code: 4997)

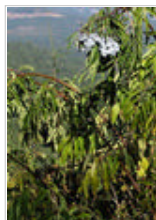
The evergreen foliage has a low-growing, dense habit with dark bluish-purple flowers from late fall to early winter. Reputed to be resistant to winter damage. (18"-24" x 3'-4") Zn7.



Salvia darcyi

Galeana red sage (Code: 7425)

Long, terminal, bright red flower spikes rise above foliage in late spring and early summer. It spreads by stolons to produce wide clumps that are densely covered with the pastel green triangular shaped leaves. (24"-36" x 24"-36") Zn8.



Sambucus nigra ssp. caerulea

Blue Elderberry (Code: 7239)

NW native deciduous shrub with pinnate compound leaves and creamy-white, flat-topped flowers 6" in width that bloom from late spring to early summer. Dark blue berries follow in summer and fall and are often made into jams. (12-20' x 8'-12") Zn4.



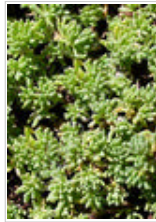

Sedum 'Abbeydore'

Stonecrop (Code: 4026)

NEW! A garden-worthy, compact form of upright Sedum that stays bushy and won't flop. Rose-pink flowers appear above blue-green succulent foliage in September. This recent introduction is one of the best! (16" x 18") Zn4.



Sedum bithynicum 'Sea Stars'

Turkish Sedum (Code: 6592)

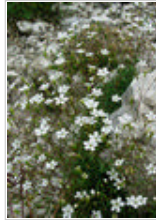
Finely textured, gray-green leaves are topped by small star-shaped white flowers in summer. This is an excellent evergreen, low maintenance plant for rock gardens. (2" x 18"-24") Zn5.



Sedum palmeri

Stonecrop (Code: 5313)

The waxy, succulent blue-green leaves form a carpet that drapes over stones or walls. Yellow, star-like flowers appear in late winter or early spring. (4"-6" x 12") Zn7.



Silene quadrifida

Alpine Champion (Code: 4650)

White flowers with fringed petals bloom in late spring and early summer. Narrow, glossy, evergreen leaves add interest year round. It requires excellent drainage. (6"-9" x 12"-16") Zn5.



Sisyrinchium angustifolium 'Lucerne'

Blue Eyed Grass (Code: 5559)

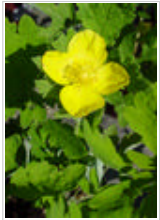
From late spring into summer, deep blue blooms with yellow-starred centers dot sword-like foliage. It adds a neat appearance for edging the front of the border, or mixed plantings. (6"-10" x 8"-10") Zn3.



Smilacina stellata

Star-Flowered False Solomon Seal (Code: 6541)

NEW! Northwest native false Solomon's seal with zigzag stems that spread to form a small colony. White star-shaped flowers appear in spring followed by greenish berries that eventually turn black. (24" x 48") Zn3.



Stylophorum diphyllum

Wood Poppy, Celandine Poppy (Code: 5644)

Bright yellow poppy-like flowers appear in early to mid spring above deeply lobed leaves. 3-5 flowers open at each terminal inflorescence. Easily spreads by seed. Native to eastern US woods. (18"-24" x 18"-24") Zn4.



Thuja plicata

Western Red Cedar (Code: 7238)

Tall, NW native conifer with tiny scale-like leaves arranged in flattened sprays. Small seed cones face upward on the branches. The wood is rot resistant. It prefers moist, well-drained soil. (50' or more x 20' or more) Zn5.



Valeriana supina

Dwarf Valerian (Code: 4358)

Very aromatic oval leaves form a thick carpet, covered with fragrant pink flowers in spring. This alpine plant quickly-spreads in sun or partial shade. (4" x 12") Zn4.



Verbascum 'Eleanor's Blush'

Mulein (Code: 7307)

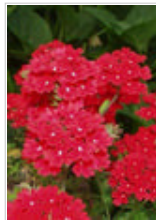
A chance seedling with large, gray-green leaves and strong flower spikes of peachy-orange with lighter centers. Remove spent flowers for rebloom. (36"-40" x 12"-18") Zn5.



Verbascum 'Pandora'

Mulein (Code: 7306)

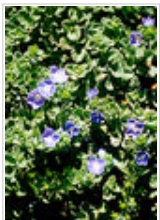
Stately flower spikes are dusky pinkish-purple with darker centers, blooming midsummer. Removing spent flowers encourages rebloom. (36"-40" x 12"-18") Zn5.



Verbena canadensis 'Taylortown Red'

Canadian Verbena (Code: 5934)

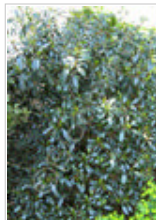
Bright red flowers bloom nonstop all summer above low-spreading foliage. Easy to grow, this trailing plant looks nice in hanging baskets or use it as a groundcover. (2"-3" x 24"-36") Zn7.



Veronica 'Reavis'

Speedwell (Code: 6666)

NEW! This evergreen groundcover form is both heat tolerant and vigorous. It grows rapidly and covers the garden with small, true blue flowers in mid-spring. (2"-3" x 18"-36") Zn4.



Viburnum propinquum

Chinese Viburnum (Code: 6479)

Elegant compact shrub with evergreen, glossy dark green foliage. White summer flowers bloom on red stems and turn to metallic-blue berries in fall. (10'-12' x 6') Zn7.



Yucca gloriosa var. recurvifolia 'Bright Star'

Adam's Needle (Code: 6012)

Tri-colored, sword-like, evergreen foliage forms a rosette in shades of ivory, pink and green. Lavender flowers rise above the drought tolerant blades in summer. (36" x 36") Zn7. PP17653 Propagation Prohibited.
